



Harmony Primary School Reconciliation Action Plan

Harmony Primary School is in the initial stages of creating a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). The RAP is a formal statement of commitment to reconciliation that outlines a series of actions and strategies aligned with measurable targets that can be tracked to monitor progress.

The RAP will:

- Empower teachers, parents and community members to integrate Aboriginal culture and understanding into day-to-day operations at Harmony Primary School, both within the classroom and throughout the wider school community.
- Deepen the level of understanding that students and staff from Harmony Primary School have of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and culture.

The development of a RAP will launch an ongoing commitment to improving the way in which Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures are shared with the school community.

In order to effectively develop an action plan that outlines agreed strategies, targets and responsibilities, one of first steps is to form a RAP working group to provide on going feedback and input. The working group will be comprised of the administration team, key teaching staff, education assistants, parents and community members. This group will allow for rich discussion and consideration of how the RAP will be established and developed during its implementation within the school.

Expressions of Interest for RAP parents/community members:

We are currently accepting expressions of interest from up to five parents and community members interested in joining our RAP working group, to provide feedback and input into the direction we are taking.

Meetings will be held termly (4 times per year), with the next meeting anticipated to take place in June 2019 (exact date TBC).
